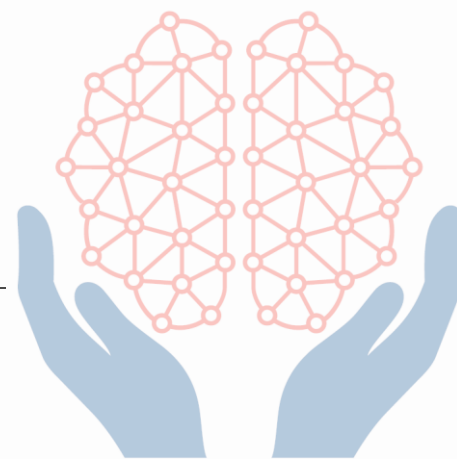

Specialists in Critical Care Medicine, therefore, possess expertise in,

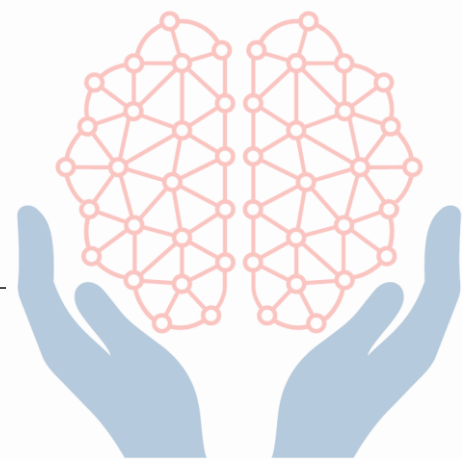
1. Resuscitation of critically ill patients
2. Advanced physiological monitoring
3. Provision of advanced organ support
4. Diagnosis and disease management in the context of the critical illness
5. Provision of symptom control of such patients
6. Management and support of the family of the critically ill patient
7. End of life care
8. Leading the intensive care team
9. Coordination of multi-specialty input to complicated clinical cases in the unique context of critical care

The management of critically ill patients in intensive care units by full time dedicated Specialists in Critical Care Medicine has demonstrated a significant improvement in the outcome of such patients with regards to the reduction in mortality and in the rate of complications.

Further, the provision of care for patients in Intensive Care Units by dedicated Specialists in Critical Care Medicine has been recognized as an international standard of care by professional and academic bodies across the world.

Additionally, the Ministry of Health in Sri Lanka has recognized the requirement of Specialists in Critical Care Medicine in order to upgrade the delivery of care towards critically ill patients.

Therefore, in order to strengthen the field of Critical Care Medicine in Sri Lanka, Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists was incorporated under the companies act no. 07 of 2007 on 10th May 2021 and Inaugural General Meeting was held on 29th July 2021



1 Vision of the College

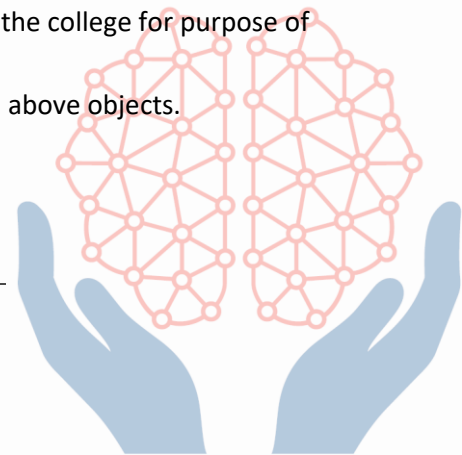

2 Strategic Aims and Objectives

Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists is a patient centered professional organization which aims at the enhancement of the field of critical care medicine in Sri Lanka.

Following are the specific objectives of the college.

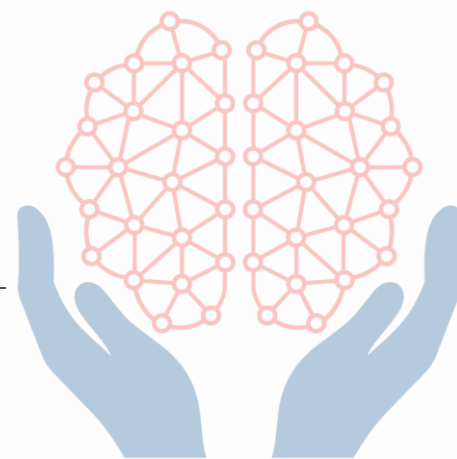
3.2 Council

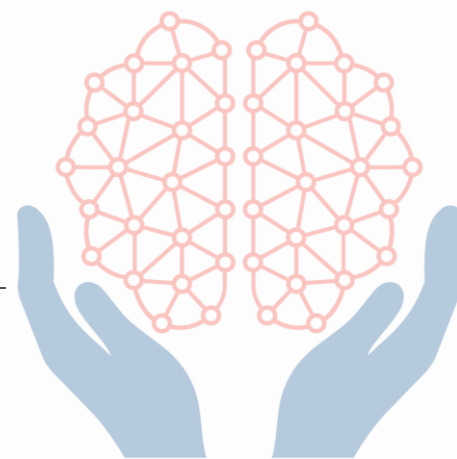

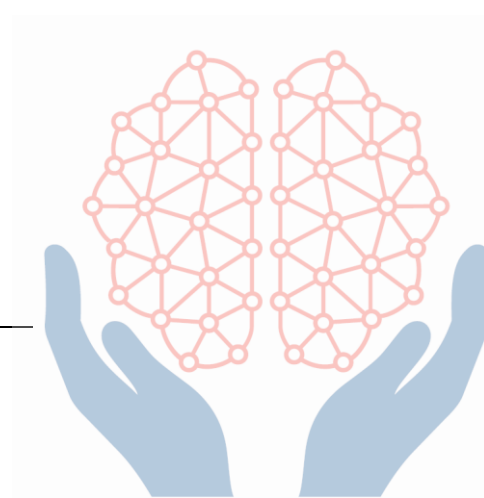

4 Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists: Year 2022/2023

Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists continued in its victorious journey in uplifting the field of critical care medicine, supporting the professionals and caring for the critically ill patients during the last year. Not forgetting the fact that the college had to face two overlapping unprecedented disruptions in Sri Lankan society immediately after its inception, it could serve the field in its best capacity. We had to face the constantly evolving realities of the COVID-19 pandemic and economic crisis affecting the infrastructure as well as the intensive care manpower in all strata, throughout the year immediately after.

Over the year as a professional body, the Council responded by refining the strategies to focus on strengthening the capacity of the college to safeguard its primary objectives. Needless to say, the prime motive of the college which is to ensure that all Sri Lankans have quality healthcare and best clinical outcomes have remained the driving force behind the capacity building efforts undertaken by the Council. As per our strategic map, the council continued to prioritize on academic activities, training in critical care and on providing advocacy to uplift the field. During the year the Council and the membership have shown their versatility and potential, taking critical care in Sri Lanka to much higher standards globally, through excellent professionalism and international representations.

This report amalgamates the activities and programmes conducted by the Council and the college for the year 2022/2023 comprehensively.

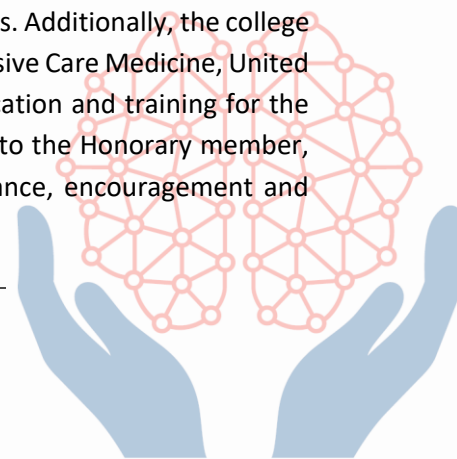
4.1 Postgraduate Training: Activities of the College for the year 2022/2023

4.1.1 Standalone curriculum and prospectus for MD and Board Certification in Critical Care Medicine

Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists was instrumental in developing a standalone curriculum and prospectus for MD and Board Certification in Critical Care Medicine in collaboration with Postgraduate Institute of Medicine (PGIM). Members of the college participated in Curriculum Development Committee of PGIM and contributed immensely to the development of the prospectus.

The prospectus describes the standalone training program leading to MD and Board Certification in Critical Care Medicine, for which the trainees are selected for postgraduate training by a selection examination. It aims to fulfill the national service requirement of producing Specialists in Critical Care Medicine in adequacy. The prospectus provides the detailed description of full-time postgraduate training which extends across six years and comprises of three stages.

Further, MD (Critical Care Medicine) degree conferred by the University of Colombo and the Board Certification in critical care medicine corresponds to Level 12 in the Sri Lanka Qualification Framework (SLQF) of the Ministry of Higher Education published in 2012 by the University Grants Commission. The process of approval from the relevant authorities is currently at its final stages. Additionally, the college has taken steps to continue the ongoing discussions with the Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine, United Kingdom, paving the way towards British accreditation in critical care education and training for the course. The Council and the college like to extend its gratitude and thanks to the Honorary member, retires consultant Dr (Mrs) Shirani Hapuarachchi for her continuous guidance, encouragement and mentorship through this process.



4.1.2 Diploma in Critical Care Medicine

The college continued empowering and refining the critical care diploma programme by organizing practice examinations at the selection exams, conducting lectures and training the diploma trainees in skills at bedside. Almost all the academic events which spanned the events calendar of the college for the year 2022-2023 assisted the development of the diploma trainees in an enormous way.

4.1.3 Representing the College at Specialty Board in Critical Care Medicine

The academic supervision of the current training programmes leading to Board Certification in Critical Care Medicine and Diploma in Critical Care Medicine is executed by the Specialty Board in Critical Care Medicine of Board of Studies in Multidisciplinary Study Courses of Postgraduate Institute of Medicine.

The Specialty Board in Critical Care Medicine is chaired by Dr Dilshan Priyankara (President, Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists). The representatives of Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists in the Specialty Board contribute significantly to the development and supervision of the academic programmes in order to uplift the field of within and beyond country.

4.2 Academic Programs: Activities of the College for the year 2021/2022

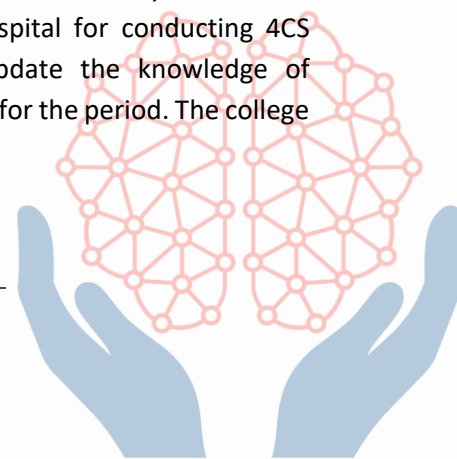
4.2.1 Critical Care Monthly Update

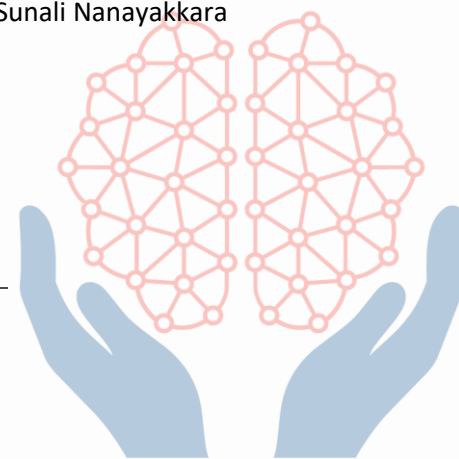

4.2.1 4CS Grand Rounds and Journal Club

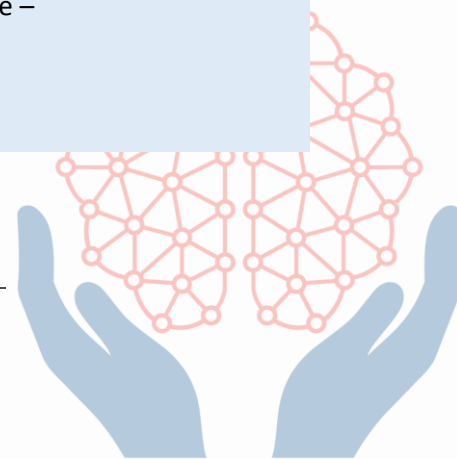

4.2.3 Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine (ISCCM) collaboration Workshops

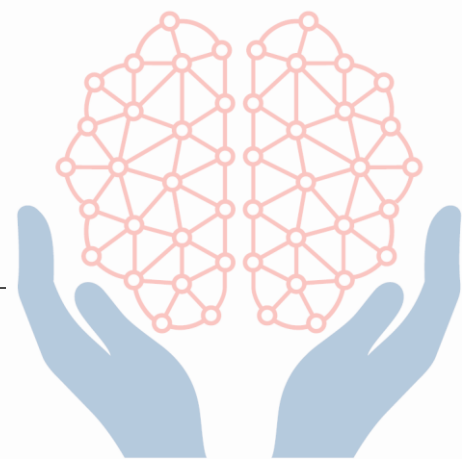
Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists is humbly honored to mark the inaugural Indo-Lanka collaborative critical care workshop on mechanical ventilation and haemodynamic monitoring, which was held as a 2-day event at the University Hospital, General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University, Boralesgamuwa, Sri Lanka, in December 2022. The event was highly successful with the contribution of seven renowned Indian faculty of intensive care consultants (Dr Rajesh Mishra - Immediate past president/ISCCM, Dr Rajesh Pande – Immediate past secretary/ISCCM, Dr Srinivas Samavedam, Dr Sharmili Sinha, Dr Y P Singh, Dr Vijay Mishra and Dr Sumit Ray) representing ISCCM, experienced local faculty of critical care specialists representing 4CS and the participation of 100 plus registrants, mainly trainees in critical care and anaesthesia. The event paved the way for future bond between ISCCM and 4CS. The college congratulates the organizing committee and all the members who tirelessly worked to make this tenure a success.

4.2.4 Fundamental Critical Care Support (FCCS) Provider Course of Society of Critical Care Medicine, USA

Dr Chamin Weerasekara has laid down the initial steps to conduct Fundamental Critical Care Support Course of Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM) of United States in order to enhance the delivery of care towards critically ill patients in Sri Lanka. The college held its first FCCS provider course in collaboration with Galle Medical Association, in May 2023 at Faculty of Medicine, University of Ruhuna. The participation was excellent as well as the feedback. This internationally recognized certification course would undoubtedly fulfill the requirement of having a globally linked training program for providers in Sri Lanka.

4.2.5 Mock MCQ session for Critical Care Diploma Trainees

A mock MCQ session was organized by Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists in October 2022 in order to upgrade the standards of trainees of Diploma in Critical Care Medicine. The second session of mock MCQ webinar is planned at the end of August 2023. Members of the council and college participated actively in forming questions, scrutiny and as examiners/resource persons.



4.3 Dissemination of Scientific Knowledge: Scientific Literature of the College 2022/23

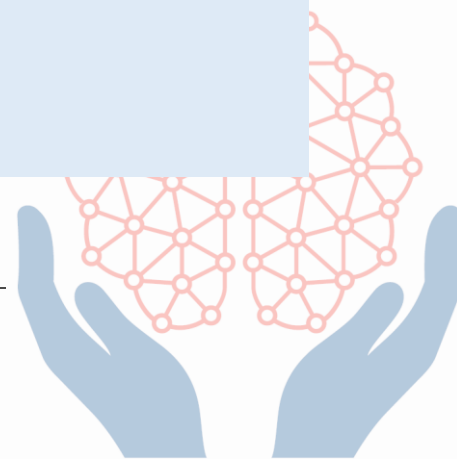
4.3.1 Newsletter of Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists

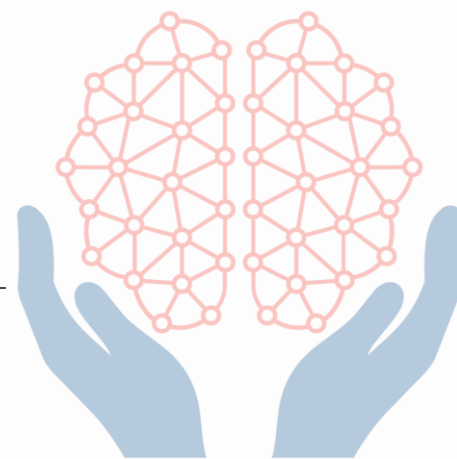
4.3.2 Scientific Literature
