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Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists

Critical care medicine is the specialty which encompasses the knowledge and practice concerned with the treatment of patients who have, or at risk of having, or recovering from, potentially life-threatening failure of one or more of organ systems of the body. Specialists in critical care medicine, therefore, possess expertise in,

1. Resuscitation of critically ill patients
2. Advanced physiological monitoring
3. Provision of advanced organ support
4. Diagnosis and disease management in the context of the critical illness
5. Provision of symptom control of such patients
6. Management and support of the family of the critically ill patient
7. End of life care
8. Leading the intensive care team
9. Coordination of multi-specialty input to complicated clinical cases in the unique context of critical care

The management of critically ill patients in intensive care units by full time dedicated specialists in critical care medicine has demonstrated a significant improvement in the outcome of such patients with regards to the reduction in mortality and in the rate of complications.

Further, the provision of care for patients in intensive care units by dedicated specialists in critical care medicine has been recognized as an international standard of care by professional and academic bodies across the world.

Additionally, the ministry of health in Sri Lanka has recognized the requirement of specialists in critical care medicine in order to upgrade the delivery of care towards critically ill patients.

Therefore, in order to strengthen the field of critical care medicine in Sri Lanka, Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists was incorporated under the companies act no. 07 of 2007 on 10th May 2021 and inaugural general meeting was held on 29th July 2021.



1 Vision of the College

The Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists is committed to uplift the field of intensive care medicine in Sri Lanka as an independent, patient centered professional organization comprises of specialists in critical care medicine.



2 Strategic Aims and Objectives

Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists is a patient centered professional organization which aims at the enhancement of the field of critical care medicine in Sri Lanka.



4 Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists: Year 2023/2024

Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists continued in its victorious journey in uplifting the field of critical care medicine, supporting the professionals and caring for the critically ill patients during the last year. Not forgetting the fact that the college had to face the continued emigration of colleagues, it could serve the field in its best capacity, with the help of all its members.

Over the year as a professional body, the Council continued its commitment and engagement by refining the strategies to focus on strengthening the capacity of the college to safeguard its primary objectives. Needless to say, the prime motive of the college which is to ensure that all Sri Lankans have quality healthcare and best clinical outcomes have remained the driving force behind the capacity building efforts undertaken by the Council. As per our strategic map, the council continued to prioritize on academic activities, training in critical care and on providing advocacy to uplift the field, especially surfacing its long-awaited dream, the inaugural scientific conference, a reality. During the year the Council and the membership have shown their versatility and potential, taking critical care in Sri Lanka to much higher standards globally, through excellent professionalism, team dynamics, organizational skills and international affiliations.

This report amalgamates the activities and programmes that were conducted by the Council and the college for the year 2023/2024 comprehensively.

4.1 Postgraduate Training: Activities of the college for the year 2023/2024

4.1.1 Standalone curriculum and prospectus for MD and board certification in Critical Care Medicine

Ceylon college of critical care specialists was instrumental in developing a standalone curriculum and prospectus for MD and Board Certification in critical care medicine in collaboration with postgraduate institute of medicine (PGIM). Members of the college participated in curriculum development committee of PGIM and contributed immensely to the development of the prospectus.

The prospectus describes the standalone training program leading to MD and Board Certification in critical care medicine, for which the trainees are selected for postgraduate training by a selection examination. It aims to fulfill the national service requirement of producing specialists in critical care medicine in adequacy. The prospectus provides the detailed description of full-time postgraduate training which extends across six years and comprises of three stages.

Further, MD (Critical care medicine) degree conferred by the university of Colombo and the board certification in critical care medicine corresponds to Level 12 in the Sri Lanka Qualification Framework (SLQF) of the ministry of higher education published in 2012 by the university grants commission (UGC). The process of approval from the relevant authorities is currently at its final stages. Additionally, the college has taken steps to continue the ongoing discussions with the faculty of intensive care medicine (FICM), United Kingdom, paving the way towards British accreditation in critical care education and training for the course. The Council and the college like to extend its gratitude and thanks to the Honorary member, retired consultant Dr (Mrs) Shirani Hapuarachchi for her continuous guidance, encouragement and mentorship through this process.



4.1.2 Diploma in Critical Care Medicine

The college continued empowering and refining the critical care diploma programme by organizing practice examinations at the selection exams, both MCQ (August 2023) and OSCE (November 2023), conducting lectures through PGIM and training the diploma trainees in skills at bedside. Almost all the academic events which spanned the events calendar of the college for the year 2023-2024 assisted the development of the diploma trainees in an enormous way. This was clearly depicted on the feedback summaries the college gained after each academic and training activity.

4.1.3 Representing the College at Specialty Board in Critical Care Medicine

The academic supervision of the current training programmes leading to board certification in critical care medicine and diploma in critical care medicine are executed by the Specialty Board in critical care medicine of board of studies in multidisciplinary study courses of postgraduate institute of medicine.

The Specialty Board in critical care medicine is chaired by Dr Dilshan Priyankara (President, Ceylon college of critical care specialists (4CS). The representatives of 4CS in the Specialty Board contribute significantly to the development and supervision of the academic programmes in order to uplift the training and advancement of professional development of the trainees in the field, within and beyond the country.



4.2 Academic Programs: Activities of the College for the year 2023/2024

4.2.1 Critical Care Monthly Update

In order to upgrade the knowledge of intensive care professionals on advancements in critical care medicine, the college conducted monthly updates virtually on selected topics. The college is grateful to Dr Lilanthi Subasinghe for coordinating the sessions.








4.2.6 Opening of post-ICU clinic at Colombo South Teaching Hospital – CSTH-PULSE

Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists is honored to be involved in the historical day in Colombo South Teaching Hospital (CSTH) as the first 'Post ICU Life Support and Evaluation - PULSE clinic' was established on 21st of May 2024 by the Department of Anaesthesiologists and Intensivists. It was a day of celebration of the ICU survivors who survived due to the hard work and dedication of the ICU staff in managing and caring for the complex critically ill patients. The PULSE clinic opening ceremony was graced by the presence of Honorable Health Secretary Dr. P. G. Maheepala and Director General of Health Services Dr. Asela Gunawardena. With the establishment of the first Intensive Care Unit in 1950s in Copenhagen, Denmark during the Polio epidemic, critical care medicine has expanded and grown into a highly specialized, sophisticated and technologically advanced field of medicine with invasive therapies for organ support. However, these therapies along with critical illness ultimately leads to adverse outcomes such as the Post Intensive Care Syndrome (PICS). This long-lasting impairment of physical, cognitive and psychological function affects the quality of life of the patients and their families. The concept of post ICU follow up clinics has evolved to recognize clinical impairments, provide therapeutic interventions and support to patients and their families to ensure a smooth rehabilitation back to normal life following critical illness. It is with this intention that the PULSE Clinic was established in CSTH. The opening of the clinic was followed by a ceremony where the Guest of Honour was Consultant Anaesthesiologist Dr. Shirani Hapuarachchi who highlighted the importance of establishing a Post ICU follow up clinic and thereby improving the quality of health care services and the lives of patients.

4.2.7 Sepsis Forum India – The international experts meet on difficult airway management & pulmonary care

Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists collaborated with the Sepsis Forum India to hold the international experts meet on difficult airway management & pulmonary care from 1st – 3rd December 2023 at the Cinnamon Lakeside Hotel. It was a great collaborative effort to create awareness about sepsis in the medical domain, to improve patient outcomes & reduce the burden of the disease along with the selected specific topics of airway management and pulmonary care. The objectives were to promote an improved understanding of sepsis, to educate clinicians on various aspects of sepsis management and dissemination of knowledge related to sepsis among healthcare providers. A number of critical care trainees, postgraduate doctors and consultants from Sri Lanka and India participated in the event and the feedback was excellent.



4.2.8 A glimpse of the inaugural scientific session of the College 2024

A long- awaited dream came true for the 4CS last July with the commencement of the inaugural scientific session from 24th to 30th July 2024 at Colombo. It was accessorized with many educational and entertaining events that kept every participant standing on their toes from start to end.


Four didactic workshops were conducted aiming at doctors and nurses working in intensive care units. The nurses 1 day workshop, “critical care nursing” coordinated by Dr. Sankalpa Vithange, was on the 24th of July at the neurotrauma auditorium, National hospital of Sri Lanka with the participation of 50 nurses. On 25th July, “Beyond SIMV” was an advanced ventilation training 1 day program held at the neuro trauma auditorium targeted at post graduate trainees in ICU and anaesthesia. Coordinated by Dr. Makarim Mohomed and Dr. Sankalpa Vithanage, it was well received by 46 participants. The 1 day “Haemodynamic workshop” Coordinated by Dr. Rasani Wanigasooriya was held on the 26th of July at the neurotrauma auditorium with 50 participants mainly in post graduate training. The post congress work shop “Critically ill surgical patient” coordinated by Dr. Waruni Samaranayake and Dr. Chamali Aluwihare was a collaborative project with the College of Surgeons of Sri Lanka. It was held on 30th of July at the neurotrauma auditorium with 48 participants.

All workshops were equipped with up-to-date information delivered by means of lectures, group discussions, hands-on workshops, demonstrations and quizzes. Both local as well as overseas faculty contributed with their invaluable time and effort to bring out the maximum to these educational forums. The workshops were accredited by the Royal College of Anaesthetists UK and by Ministry of Health, Sri Lanka, Continuous Professional Development program.

The presidential night was on the 26th of July at the Nelum Hall, Water's Edge hotel, Colombo. The fun filled night was graced by many distinguished guests both local and foreign. Music, singing, dancing, chatting, good food and drinks as well as quizzes on reminiscence kept the audience immersed in a hoopla mood late into the night.

The illuminative and most distinguished function of all, the inauguration night was on the 27th of July at the Grand ball room of the Hotel Galadari. Esteemed guests of many fields added colour to the already vibrant atmosphere. Following the ceremonial procession and traditional formalities, the guests were welcomed by the president of 4CS, Dr. Dilshan Priyankara. Dr. Palitha Maheepala, Secretary, Ministry of Health Sri Lanka, was the chief guest and Dr. Shirani Hapuarachchi, past consultant anaesthetist who pioneered the formation of the Ceylon College of Critical care specialists right from the outset in 2013, was the guest of honor. Honorary fellowships were awarded to Professor Anuja Abayadeera, Professor in Anaesthetics from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Colombo and Dr. Shirani Hapuarachchi, past consultant Anaesthetist from the National hospital of Sri Lanka. Professor Jean-Louis Toboul, from Paris-Saclay University, France, delivered the oration on “fluid responsiveness: what we have learnt over the past 25 years”. The formalities were followed by an elegant yet energetic traditional dance performance by the Channa, Upuli dance academy.

The scientific session commenced on the 28th of July at the Grand Ball room, hotel Galadari. Eminent speakers both local and overseas, enlightened the enthusiastic minds of the trainees throughout the day through plenaries, symposia and debates. The fact that online faculty joined live for the question-and-answer sessions, made a huge impact on keeping the forum as live and physical as possible. The free paper session and poster session were a huge success. The quiz as the last item of the day was a nail-biting experience for the participants. The congress was accredited by the royal College of Anaesthesiologists and Continuous Professional Development program by the Ministry of Health, Sri Lanka.



4.3 Dissemination of Scientific Knowledge: Scientific Literature of the College 2023/24


4.3.1 Newsletter of Ceylon College of Critical Care Specialists
